The instructors notes to slide 204 state:

It is an acceptable technique to fire the cartridge from close range or in contact with the body of the subject. If needed the officer can then apply a drive-stun back-up with the cartridge still in place away from the deployed probes and cause a "three point" contact. This can cause NMI. Remember that a drive stun alone will usually not cause NMI.

Drive Stun with Cartridge

A drive stun with a live cartridge can be an effective technique - the probes may fire into the subject

- Whenever practical avoid the head and throat
- Low risk of over penetration
- Cartridge may not deploy when in direct contact with subject, but will still have drive stun effect
- Probes can help maintain contact with a violent suspect
 - You can then apply a drive stun away from probes to achieve NMI

Instructor Notes: If only one probe strikes a subject, the drive-stun will act as a second probe by completing the cycle. In these incidents, the drive-stun should be applied at a location away from the probe to simulate a good probe spread and achieve incapacitation.

This tactic works even if both probes strike the subject. If the probe spread is very minimal, due to a close shot or a a drive-stun with a live cartridge, a drive-stun away from the probes will increase the spread and cause incapacitation.

Drive Stun Backup

- To use drive stun without firing probes, remove live cartridge
- The drive stun mode alone will not cause NMI. It generally acts as a pain compliance tool
- If not effective, evaluate location of drive stun, consider an additional cycle to a different pressure point, or consider alternative force options
